Who can participate?

Who should I donate proceeds to?

You get to choose! Below is a list of organizations that are fighting to ensure fair elections, but we encourage you to also look for organizations working on your local level to benefit communities near you!

Organizations to support (BAKE THE VOTE!):

[Black Voters Matter](#)

Working to increase power in marginalized, predominantly Black communities with the belief that effective voting allows a community to determine its own destiny. This includes increasing voter registration and turnout, policy advocacy for fair and equal voting rights and organizational development and training.

[Fair Fight](#)

Promotes fair elections in Georgia and around the country, encourages voter participation in elections and educates voters about elections and their voting rights. Fair fight also brings awareness to the public on election reform, advocates for election reform on all levels and engages in other voter education programs and communications.

[Bake Cookies Buy Stamps - Save the USPS](#)

Use your bake sale revenue to buy stamps from the USPS! Supporting the USPS is crucial to ensuring a fair election, particularly with restrictions to in person voting with Covid-19. Buying stamps is a great way to support the USPS. Consider donating the stamps to individuals with incarcerated family members or a local non-profit.

Works 365 days a year to: obtain IDs for eligible voters, make election guides, create educational tools, help voters make and execute a plan to vote

[American Civil Liberties Union](#)

Through litigation and advocacy, the ACLU fights back against voter suppression. In addition, they advocate for policies that make it easier for Americans to vote (such as same-day and online voter registration.) Consider donating to an ACLU chapter that is particularly vulnerable to voter suppression: Mississippi, Alabama, Kentucky, Connecticut, Missouri, South Carolina, Texas, Tennessee, Florida, Kansas

[Common Cause](#)

Works across party lines to build a democracy that works for everyone by holding those in power accountable through lobbying, litigation and grassroots organizing. Common Cause is currently suing to save the US Postal Service and to reverse the dangerous anti-voting changes that the postmaster general has made.

[Brennan Center for Justice](#)

A nonpartisan law and policy institute that strives to uphold the values of democracy. They work to build an America that is democratic, just and free- for all.

[Asian Americans Advancing Justice/ Asian Law Caucus](#)

Provides a voter registration hotline with assistance in 9 Asian languages. Also assist with ballot comprehension and education on voting rights.
